

Registering an Event


- 1. First, visit the Volunteer page.
- 2. Follow the first step and add your name/email/location to register as a volunteer.
- Complete the second step and provide your city/state/country.
- 4. Then, scroll down the list of nearby events and click the button "Register to organize a new event"





Registering an Event

Step 3 of the Volunteer process is where you can register your event.



Navigating to Your Event Page

- 1. Log in using link in top menu
- 2. Click on Account
 - a. This links to past and current events you've organized
- 3. Click on your event's link and then the Manage Event button

Inclusive EV Events

- Feature used EVs / refer to Plug In America's <u>Used EV</u>
 <u>Buyer's Guide</u>
- Choose event location easily accessible via public transportation
- Choose event location easy to navigate using wheelchairs, canes, etc.
- Identify volunteer who can check-in with and, if requested, assist people with vision/hearing/mobility impairments
- Promote the event in multiple languages
- Recruit volunteers who speak multiple languages





Safe In-Person Events

- Meet requirements of local health authorities
- Independently consider an EV showcase and a Ride and Drive
- Consider the safety of both event staff and participants
- Reminder: Hand Sanitizers and wet wipes for ride and drives
- Keep windows down during test drives and wear a mask during the ride

Local Sponsorships

- What can sponsors provide?
 - Event space
 - Promote your event via email, print ads, social media, etc.
 - Contribute funds or in-kind donations such as food or raffle prizes
- What benefits can you offer sponsors?
 - Logo / brand visibility (social media, banners/posters, etc.)
 - Booth at the event
 - Potential customer leads (for dealerships)

Choose the right platform

Start by making a checklist of features you need

Audio quality is important

 Live music performances or virtual test drives may need audio improvements

Test runs are crucial. They allow you to:

- Test transitions between slide decks and other elements such as speakers and polls
- Identify awkward transitions and parts that start to feel too long
- End on the right tone



Keep it short and entertaining

 Keep each segment about 10 minutes long, and definitely no longer than 20 minutes

Use pre-recorded videos wisely

- Use only if it's more effective than a live presentation of the material
 - o Is it funny?
 - Is it well-produced or explained?
 - Does it flow with your presentation visually?

Save the call to action for the end





Online Events - Sponsor Benefits

 Value can come from direct engagement with their target audience or via branding opportunities

• Ideas for virtual sponsor benefits

- Pre-recorded sponsor message
- Pop-ups/polls asking attendees if they want to learn more about sponsor's product or service
- Include sponsor logo on welcome slide
- Event networking app that enables more direct interaction between attendees and sponsors





View an example of a virtual test drive.





- Show the EV make/model
- Explain EV charging and show an example









 Driver can talk about various EV topics while driving, such as how the vehicle performs in cold weather Find creative ways to convey the driving experience virtually
